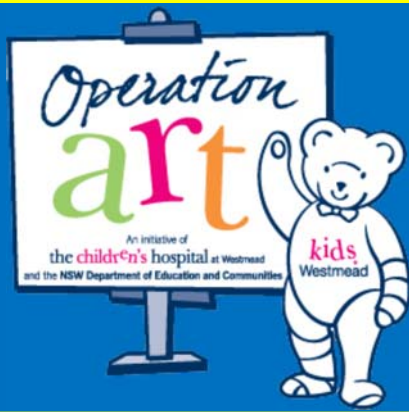
### Operation Art
