Being able to step outside their comfort zones and experience new challenges is a part of life students, and adults all need to embrace.

Did you know that 1 in 7 primary school children experience mental ill-health, 1 in 5 adults will experience mental ill health and 65% of adolescents will not seek help for mental illness? This year our school will be participating in The Resilience Project. The Resilience Project delivers positive mental health strategies to build resilience and happiness. Their approach is to work with the whole school community including teachers, students and parents, helping them to understand the importance of practising and implementing key strategies to build resilience and drive sustainable change. Staff and students were involved in information sessions in Week 7 and the program will be begin weekly lesson in Term 3.

Our thanks to Liz Mathews and Krista Schade at Intereach for their work in bringing the project to Hay and including Carrathool Public School.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT By Ben


Carrathool Public School have had a very busy two weeks with Athletics Carnival, Colour Explosion Fun Run and the Environmentors visiting our school.


SPORTS CLUB


How to use your vouchers
