Principal's Report

Welcome to Term 1 2022. Once again, we begin the year with some challenges but, working together as a community, we will manage to overcome them. As always, the health and wellbeing of our students and staff remain a priority and a variety of measures have been adopted to keep our school open and students learning in the classroom. These include

- the use of Rapid Antigen Tests twice weekly to monitor health and reduce transmission to others
- Wearing of surgical masks by staff, recommended to primary students
- Only vaccinated visitors on site
- Good hygiene, good air flow, increased cleaning and physical distancing.

As is sensible, any staff member or student who is unwell is asked to stay at home. If symptoms of Covid 19 are present they should complete a RAT or PCR test and await results. Positive cases need to be reported to both the school and the Department of Health. Negative results with no symptoms may return to school. Negative results with continued symptoms need to stay at home until symptoms cease or be diagnosed with another condition (eg Hayfever) by a doctor. We are fortunate this year that our staffing remains the same, providing continuity to our students. Teachers are Ms Sue Furner and myself, SLSOs are Mrs Mary Gilbert and Mrs Lynne Anstice, our SAM is Mrs Vickianne Rawle, Mrs Alison Keen is our cleaner and Mr Keith Warner maintains our grounds. We are lucky indeed to have these wonderful people.

We are also fortunate to be able to resume our Super Friday sessions with Booligal PS as the majority of our activities are held outside or in large, well ventilated areas. Our first Super Friday will be on 18 February.
